A Model of Success for RRR Learning?

Study Centre Circular Head and West Coast Study Hub are funded under cohort 1. Study King Island is cohort 4.

An additional Regional University Study Hub is approved under cohort 5 funding in Eastern Tasmania at St Helens, opening mid 2025.

A similar model to the RUSH network has been funded by the Commonwealth Government as the Suburban University Study Hubs.

A Suburban Hub has been approved for opening in mid 2025 at Sorell in Tasmania's south.
